

COVID-19's Impact on Latinos

- Latinos account for:
 - approximately 25% of all COVID-19 cases.
 - approximately 30% of COVID-19 deaths among children.
- In November, the Latino <u>unemployment rate was 8.8%</u> (vs. overall 6.9%).

• Nearly half (47%) of Latino households with kids have had difficulty accessing food.



National Response to COVID-19

UnidosUS's priorities: Health, Food Security, and Economic Relief

 To-date COVID response has included expanded access to testing, additional funding for SNAP and Medicaid, and unemployment benefits.

 Outstanding Priorities: low or no-cost treatment, equitable access to vaccines, and additional funding for Medicaid & SNAP

- Continuing to focus on COVID-19
- Nurturing health equity champions
- Focusing on administrative advocacy
- Continuing to develop and amplify knowledge on Latino health
